

Figure 10. Graduation rate and transfer-out rate (2007 cohort); graduation rate cohort as a percent of total entering students and retention rates of first-time students (Fall 2013)

Retention rates are measured from the fall of first enrollment to the following fall. 4 yr institutions report retention rates for students seeking a bachelor's degree. Median values for the comparison group will not add to 100%. N is the number of institutions in the comparison group. Medians are not reported for comparison groups with less than three values.
