LIFE UNIVERSITY HOSTS USA WOMEN'S EAGLES SEVENS PRACTICES In Preparation for Women's Sevens World Series, USA Women's Sevens Choose LIFE as Practice Facility

Marietta, Georgia, February 11, 2014 – The Life University (LIFE) rugby program's national prominence is no longer a secret; in fact, it's now common knowledge. Just ask the USA Women's Eagles Sevens who, in preparation for the second leg of the Women's Sevens World Series this weekend (February 15-16) at Kennesaw State's Fifth Third Bank Stadium, chose LIFE's rugby pitch and facilities for their practices leading up to the event.

"Even though we think it's far away, it's just right around the corner," explains Suggitt. "We're not losing sight of anything, and every day we are just trying to get better."

LIFE is starting up a Women's Undergraduate program itself that will begin its full-season slate of action this fall. Looking to build on the immense success of the both the Men's Undergrad and Men's Club teams at LIFE that both won 2013 National Championships in their respective divisions, the Women's squad has already begun training, scrimmaging and recruiting in advance of their season.

"I think for any young female athletes coming out of high school, they really need to take a look at Life University for rugby," says Suggitt. "We've seen the history of what they've done with the men's program here, and if they do the same thing with
