Cost of Attendance (COA) is an estimate of the total amount it may cost you to go to school for an academic period. The COA (or financial aid budget) is not a budget comprised of your personal expenses but are educational expenses that the government considers to be related to the pursuit of a degree or certificate. COA includes tuition and fees, room & board or living expenses, allowances for books & supplies, personal expenses, loan fees and transportation. **The COA is determined by the school using guidelines established by federal regulations.**
