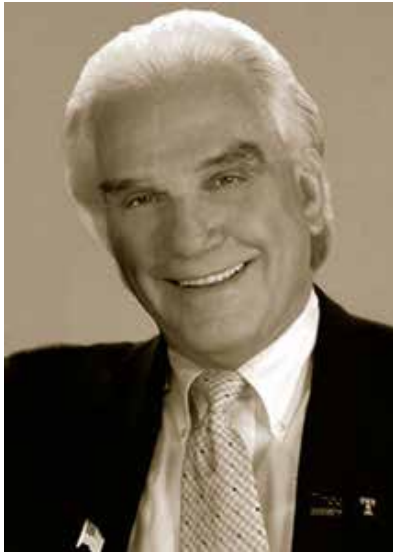

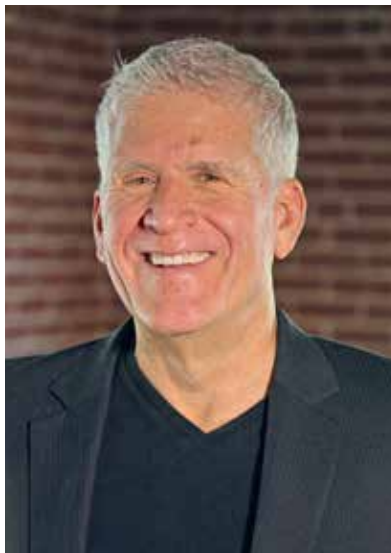

- › Earned the schools first-ever LAX win over a ranked opponent, beating #7 Marian
- › Nationally ranked 7th at the time COVID cancelled the season

#### Track

- › Bria Sands won the Mid-South Conference Indoor Athlete of the Year after breaking the conference records in both the triple jump and the long jump. Additionally, she ran on the conference champion 4x400 relay team.

#### Activities

- › Life University continues to be the largest athletics department in metro-Atlanta with more than 500 student-athletes.
- › Academic accolades have continued to climb as Life U student-athletes earned 44 NAIA Daktronics Scholar-Athlete awards, tripling their total from 2018-2019. Additionally, they earned 88 conference academic awards, their highest total in department history.
- › The department saw their highest-ever department GPA over the course of the 2019-2020 academic year, with a department average over a 3.0.

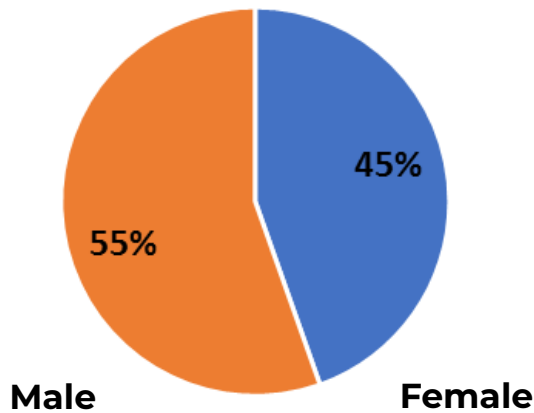

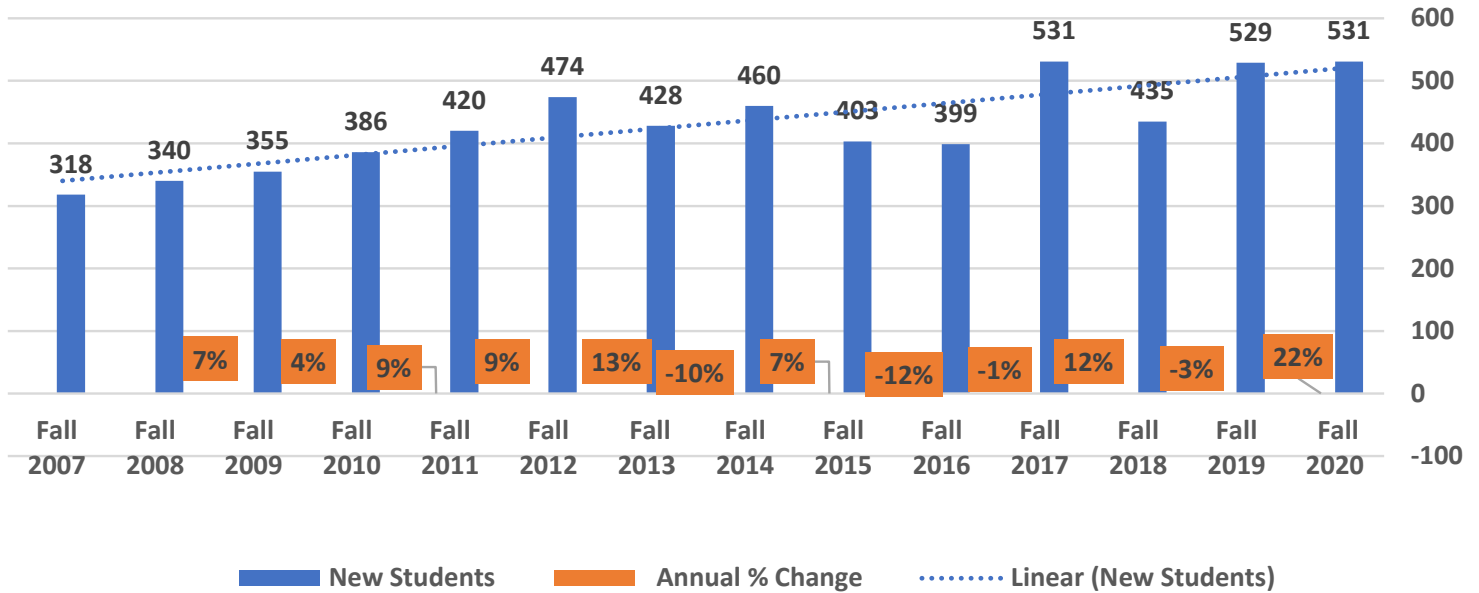

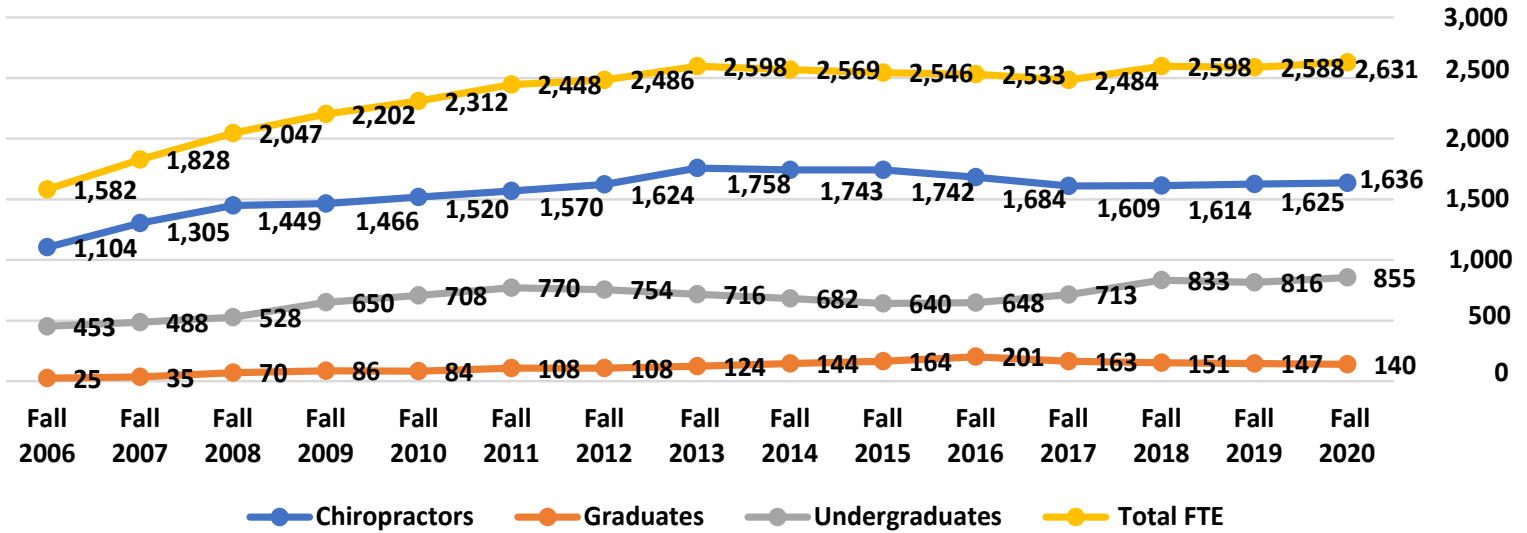

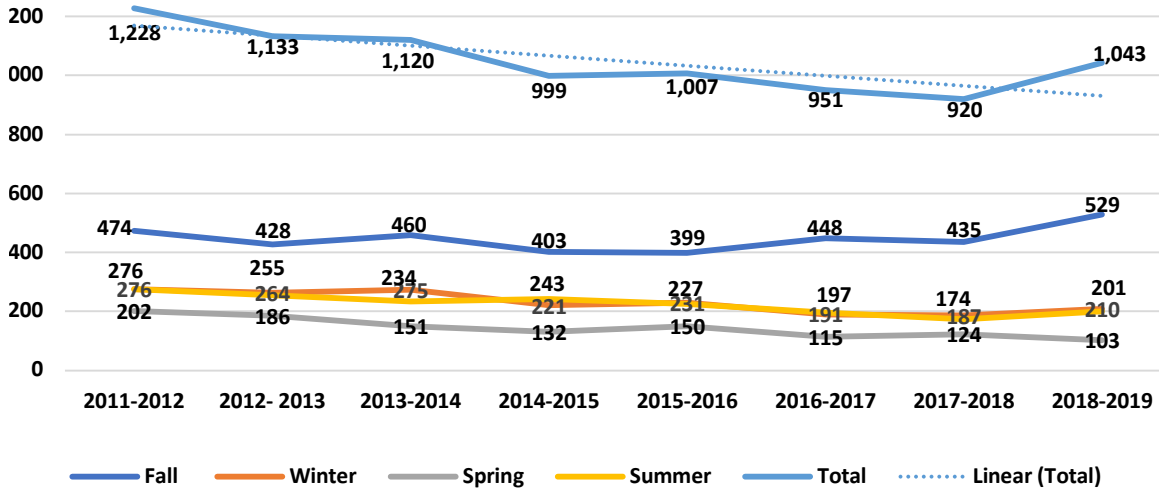

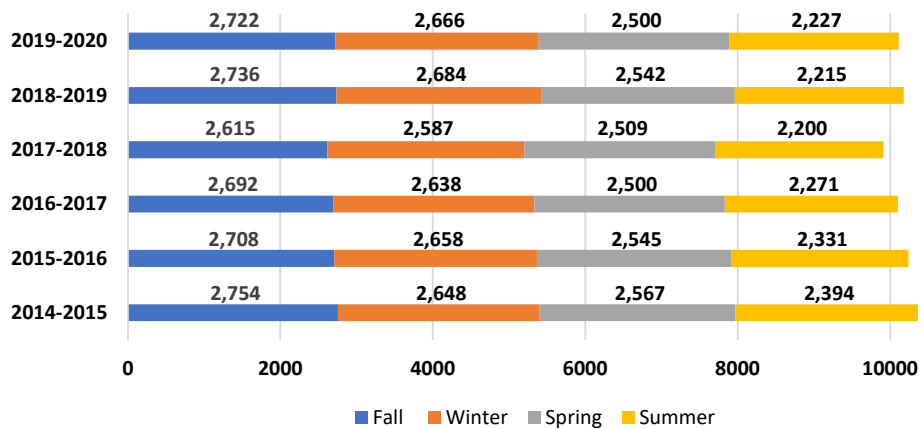

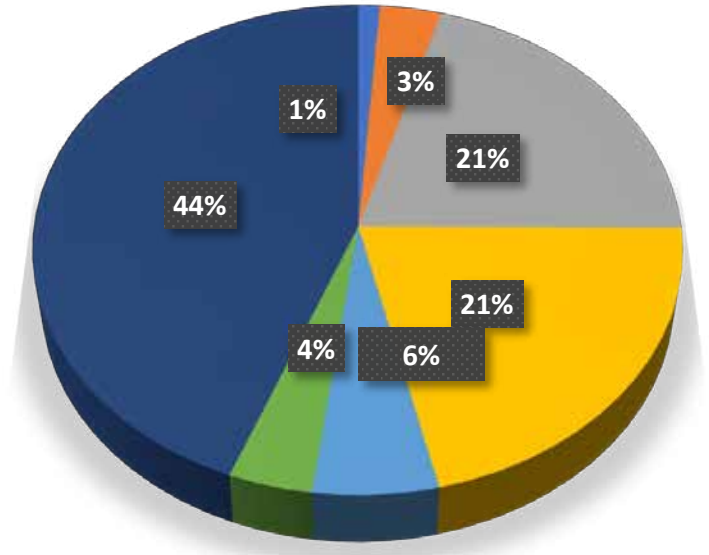

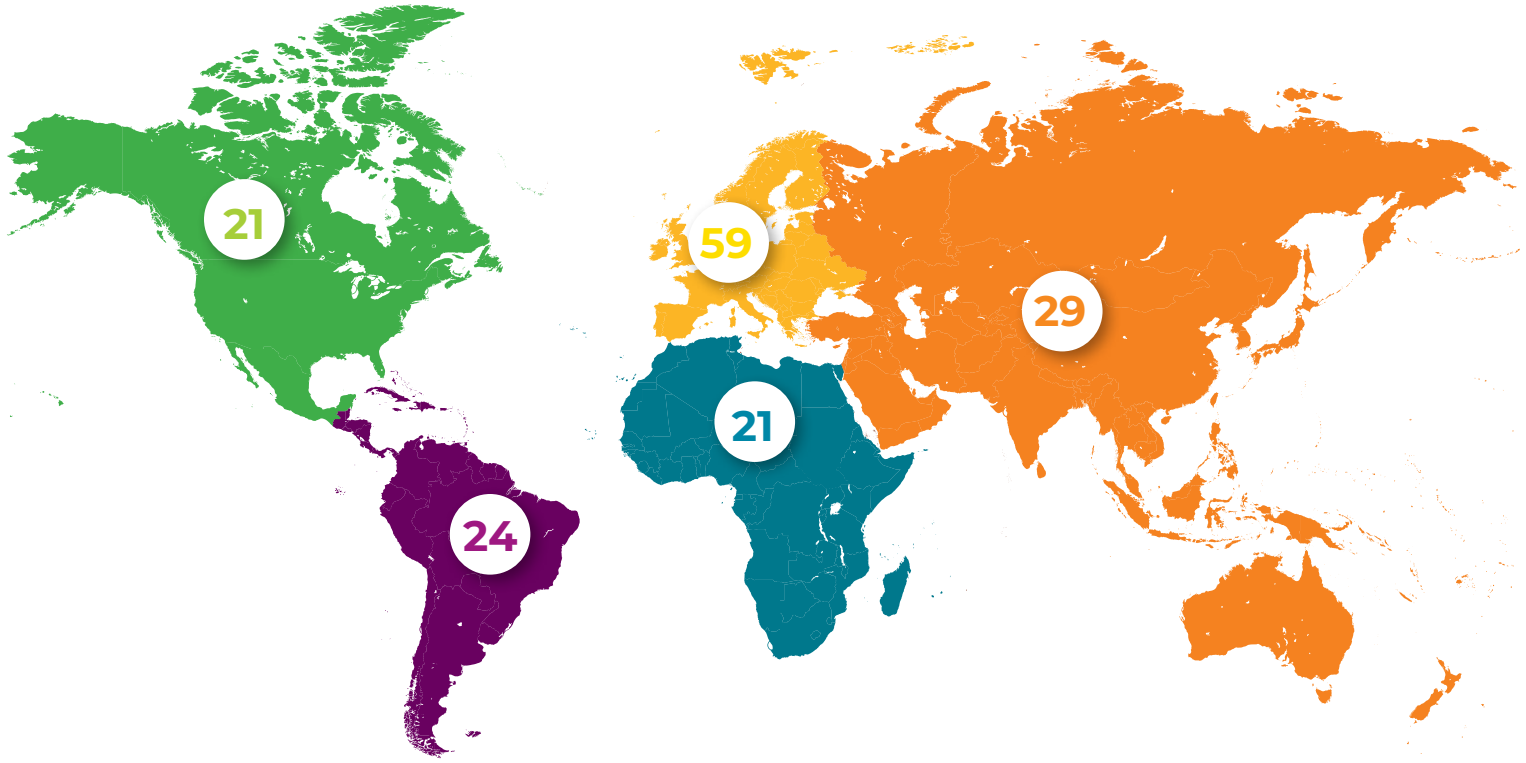

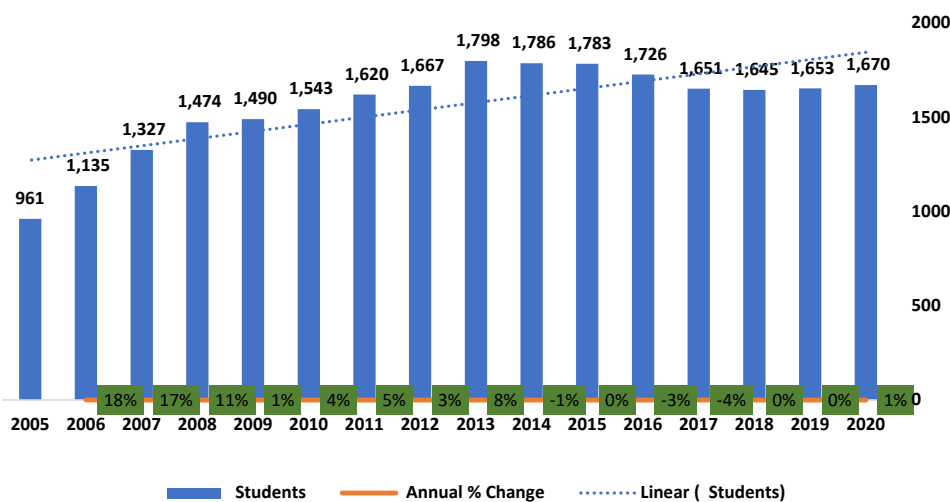

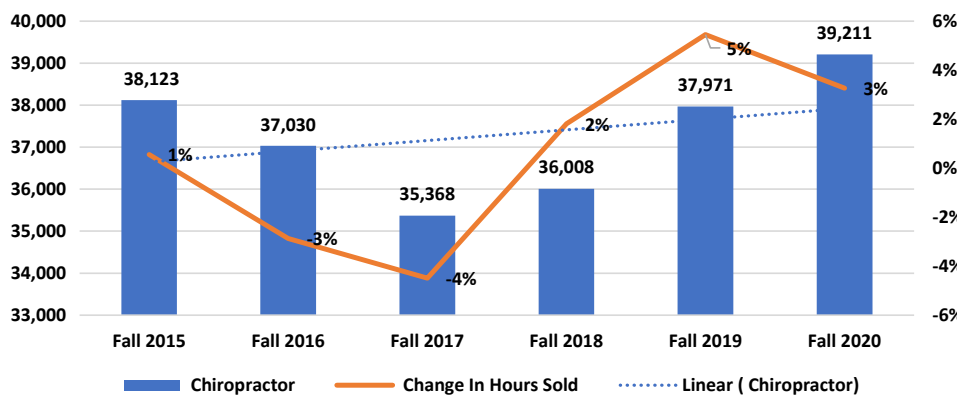

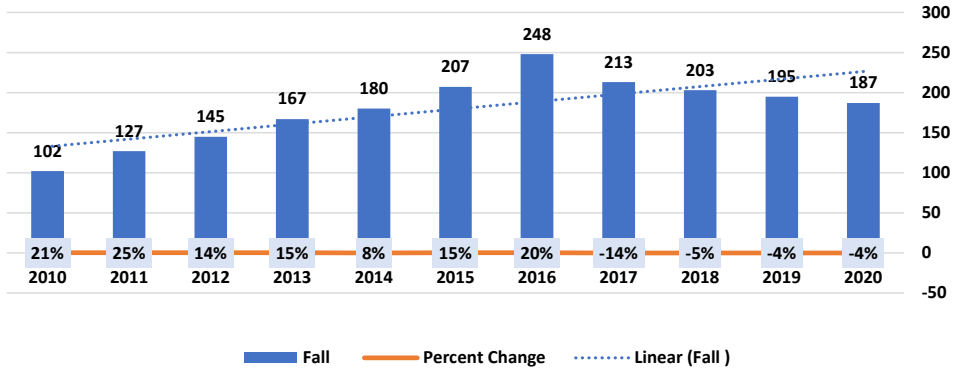

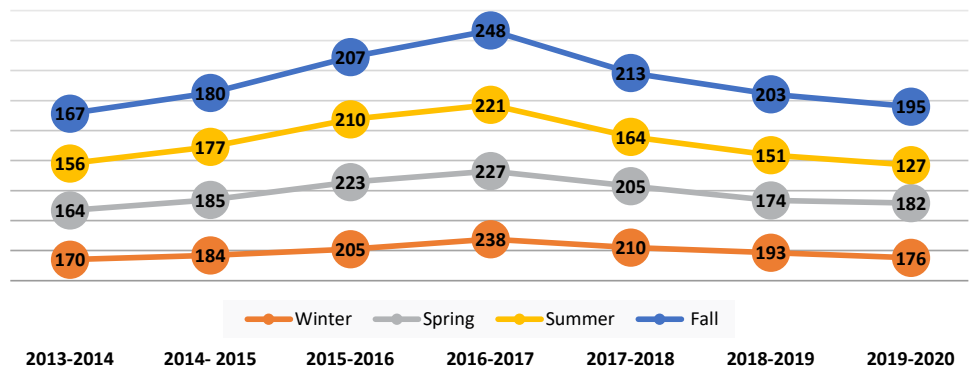

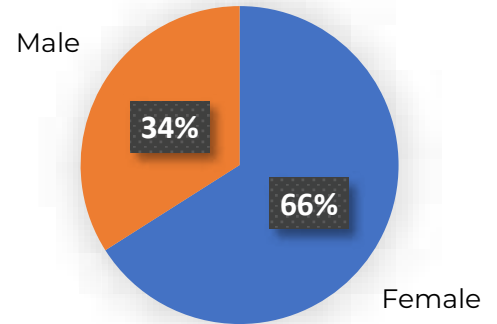

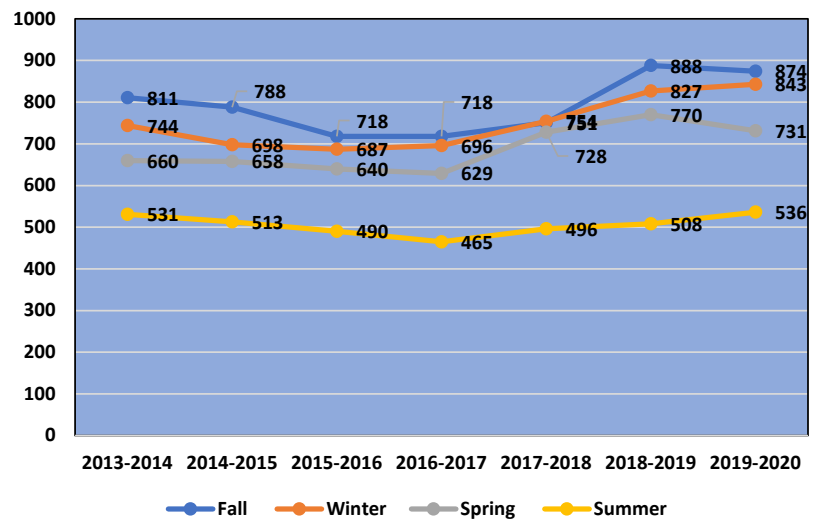

### Fall Undergraduate Headcount



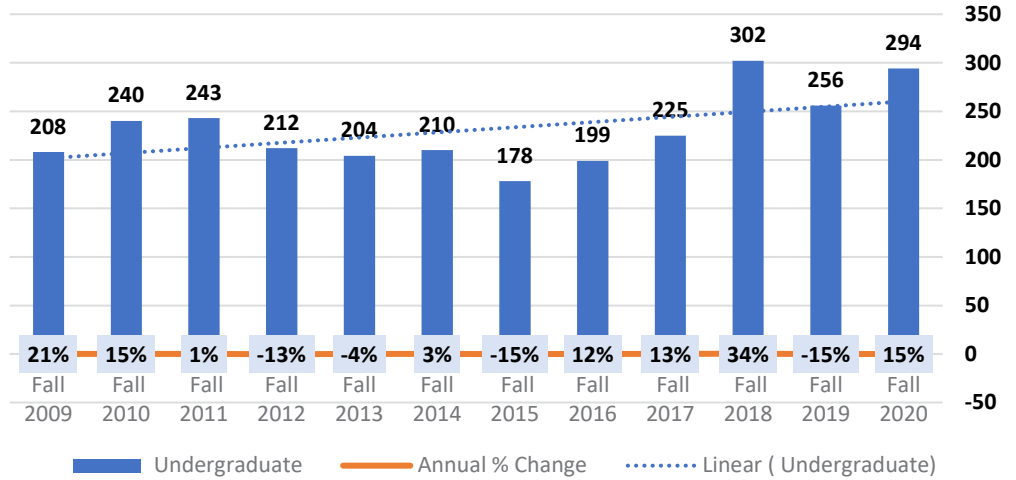
